### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

# **Governing document**

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

### Organisational structure

The organisation is an unincorporated Charity, which is governed by a board of trustees who have served throughout the year. The trustees are disclosed above under 'Trustees Information'.

The trustees are governed by the charities constitution and meet regularly throughout the year to review progress on funding applications and project work and monitor the activities of the organisation and its staff.

Trustees have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charity's Act to have due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission, including public benefit guidance.

The day to day management of the organisation is carried out by Ms Shirley Kirkland, an employee of the charity. Ms Kirkland implements and manages the policies, objectives and activities of the organisation. This is overseen by a Management Committee of trustees consisting of the Chair, the Vice-Chair, the Secretary and the Treasurer, who in turn report to the full board of trustees.

### Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

### Objectives and aims

Lee Green Lives is a local community association. Its objects are;

To further or benefit the residents of Lee Green Ward in the London Borough of Lewisham and the neighbourhood, without distinction of sex, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions, by associating together the said residents and the local authorities, voluntary and other organisations in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupations with the objective of improving the conditions of life for the residents.

In furtherance of these objects, but not otherwise, the trustees shall have power to establish or secure the establishment of a community centre and to maintain or manage or co-operate with any statutory authority in the maintenance and management of such a centre for activities promoted by the charity in the furtherance of the above objects.

### Significant activities

Lee Green Lives is a community organisation whose primary purpose is to run a community centre for local people. Our activities include;

- Social and educational groups and classes
- Advice and support for local people in need
- Activities to improve and maintain people's physical and mental health
- · Outreach to the local community
- Partnership work
- Coordinating the Lee Green Consortium of local community groups

### **ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

We have provided numerous classes and drop-ins that are popular with local residents, including;

- A Coffee & Chat session, hosted by local time bank Lee Fair Share, continued to be hugely popular.
- The seniors' exercise class continued to be very popular, including with disabled participants.
- The adult literacy, "Reading & Writing", continued to be provided.
- The knitting class runs in tandem with the sewing class.
- The computer group continued to be held, including learning new skills and creative writing.
- The Support & Advocacy service provides much-needed support for local people experiencing economic and social hardship.
- A new Warm Space project was set up at the end of the 2022-23 year.

These activities were funded by Trust for London and a new Bid for Lewisham Council's Ward NCIL fund. Core costs for a part-time coordinator and running costs (energy, phone, service charges, etc.) were paid for from a Lewisham Council Partnership (Main) Grant programme and from Garfield Weston, supplemented at the beginning of the financial year by government business support grants.

Through the Lee Green Consortium, Lee Green Lives continued to support a network of 16 local community groups, including the local library and park user groups.

# Reserves policy

Lee Green Lives shall maintain minimum reserves of £15,000 to ensure that in the event of dissolution all liabilities, legal fees and accountancy charges can be met. This policy shall be subject to annual review by the Management Committee.

### **FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

In July 2023 Galliard Homes received planning permission for the redevelopment of the Leegate shopping centre in which Lee Green Lives is based. Accordingly, we are actively seeking new premises.

# STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2023

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical costs convention and in accordance with FRS102, The Financial Reporting standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Charities Act 2011, and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Grant awards covering more than one year, are included only in respect of the current year's award element on the basis that awards for subsequent years are subject to meeting certain reporting and other stipulated requirements both during and at the end of each year before the subsequent year's grant will be considered for payment by the respective funder.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year-end date are noted as commitment but not accrued as expenditure. Costs include irrecoverable VAT where incurred.

**Taxation** 

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes the financial statements.
